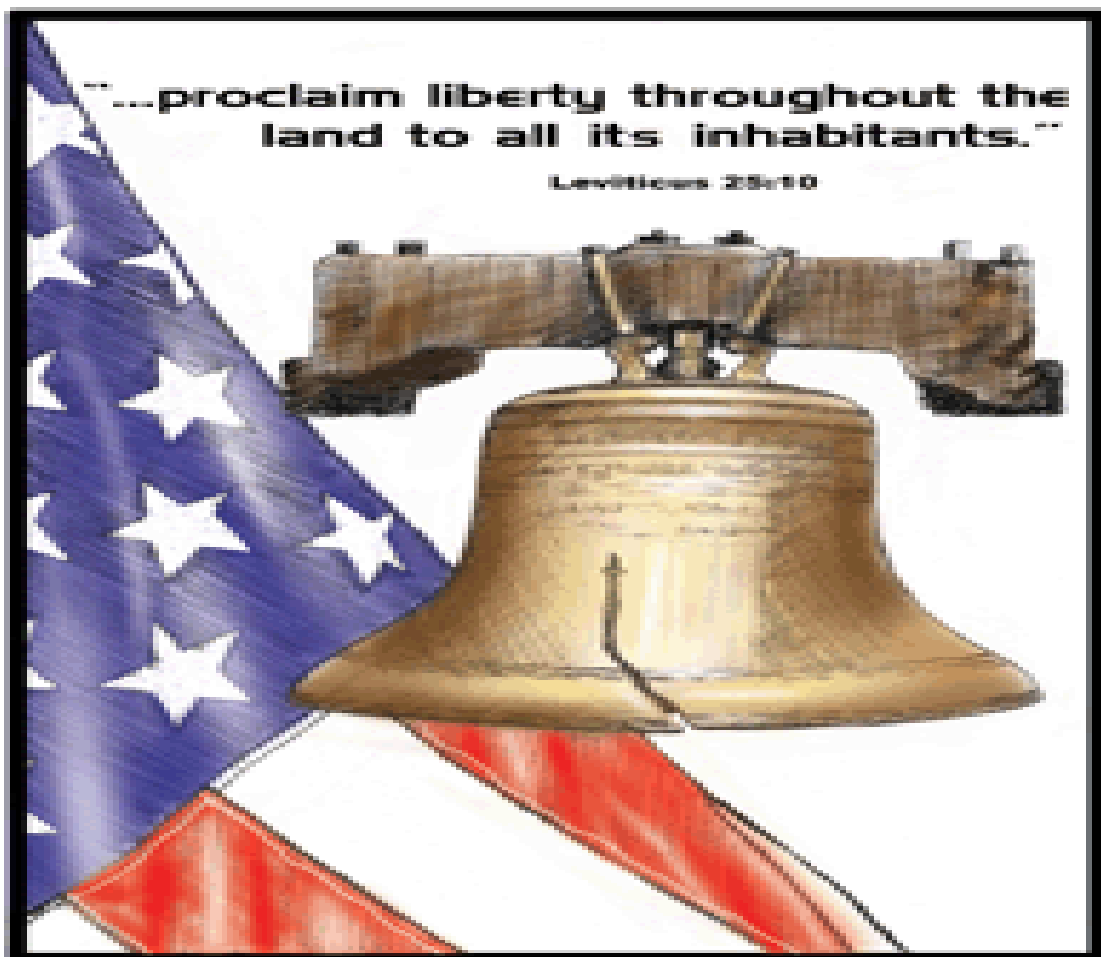

Righteousness Pays in 1,000 Ways:

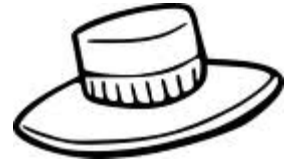

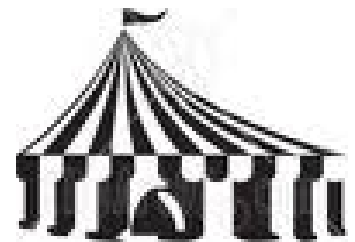
